- ❖ Pedestrian almost hit by a slow moving vehicle when the car came around a blind corner and there in the middle of the street was a walker standing in the middle of the lane looking the opposite direction.
- ❖ Stop signs are routinely ignored by drivers who don’t stop or sometime, even slow down.

Speeding is and will always be a problem not in Dorado but all of Tucson and other cities/communities. Children will always play in the streets. Since Dorado was built without sidewalks, there will always be pedestrians walking on the streets. It is a golf course community so golf carts will always be crossing streets. SO..... **the responsibility rests with every Dorado resident** to:

- ✓ Look where you are going when walking on the streets.
